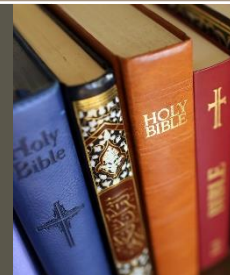

From the Principal

This past month, the school has been alive with the sound of music and text recitations as students geared up for our first big concert in two years. After a whole lot of practice, last Friday our Christmas Concert took place. Being able to celebrate the message of hope together with families, parents and grandparents was incredibly beautiful. We are also thankful the event could be livestreamed for those who could not attend. I know in my neighbourhood our non-church neighbours enjoyed tuning in and hearing our children sing and recite texts that focused on the hope we have in Christ. What a great way to be a light in the world.

Unpacking this message of hope is something the staff have been doing in their respective classrooms all year. The first big lesson our students learned this year is that worldly hope and biblical hope are not the same thing. When we think of hope, we tend to think of it as a desire for something better that is often not rooted in anything but that desire. We hope for good weather, we hope that the COVID pandemic will soon be behind us, or you might even hope for pizza tonight! That understanding of hope is typical. We just hope for the best! At best, the hope of the world is rooted in a

fallible person or thing.

However, the Christian view of hope is worlds apart from that definition of hope. Our hope is like an anchor, firm and secure. Our hope is built upon the foundation of God's revealed Word. A foundation that is strengthened by the fact we don't only live in a time when hope has been promised, but we have seen the fulfillment of that hope (as we heard in our Christmas Program). Our hope is in God. "For you have been my hope O Sovereign Lord, my confidence since my youth" (Psalm 71:5 - our theme text).



When it comes to the foundational hope we have in Christ, I am reminded of a story Ravi Zacharias used to tell:

I remember lecturing at Ohio State University, one of the largest universities in this country. I was minutes away from beginning my lecture, and my host was driving me past a new building called the Wexner Center for the Performing Arts.

He said, "This is America's first postmodern building."

I was startled for a moment, and I said, "What is a postmodern building?"

He said, "Well, the architect said that he designed this building with no design in mind. When the architect was asked, 'Why?' he said, 'If life itself is capricious, why should our buildings have any design and any meaning?' So, he has pillars that have no purpose. He has stairways that go nowhere. He has a senseless building built and somebody has paid for it."

I said, "So his argument was that if life has no purpose and design, why should the building have any design?"

He said, "That is correct."

I said, "Did he do the same with

the foundation?"

All of a sudden there was silence. You see, you and I can fool with the infrastructure as much as we would like, but we dare not fool with the foundation because it will call our bluff in a hurry.

As we enter 2022 and the second part of our school year, we can praise God that we can teach with His Word as a firm foundation for all our instruction. We can praise Him that we can teach with our hope placed firmly in Him!

Here in the school, we see God's blessings in providing us with the needed staff for the current year. In a time when there is a significant teacher shortage across Canada, having a full complement of staff is something to be very thankful for. This year we were blessed to have Mrs. Vandebos teach the first portion of the year.
