
As we continue to plan for the year ahead we can remember with thankfulness how God has carried us.

# >>> From the Principal

As we get ready to start a new year at Harvest, we step into uncharted territory for our school with the addition of grade 9/10. After years of talking about the need for a high school, it is exciting to see our community come together to make this happen. The analogy I have often thought of when starting a new venture like this is that of pioneers. The feelings they would have experienced of excitement and

trepidation are not that different from the feelings of some of us. Going into something new will have its challenges, but there is also something beautiful about being the first to lay the groundwork for those

to come.

So. with these "pioneery" thoughts, I thought the summer would be a great opportunity to read about pioneers here in Canada. There is one massive tome on pioneers that has been on my to read list for many years entitled A Furrow Laid Bare. This thousand-page book recounts the story of our sister church in Neerlandia, Alberta. In the early 1900's several families ventured from the Netherlands to northern Alberta to start a settlement in an area that was uninhabited. What

becomes abundantly clear in their history is that without the support of everyone working together, they never would have been able to survive those early years and settle the land. The importance of everyone working together is not so different than now. Without so many of you donating significant time, lending your equipment and expertise, and donating financially, both kindergarten and grade 9/10 at Harvest would not be possible. Thank you to all those who have helped and continue to help. It is truly a blessing to be in a community where everyone works together to help tell the next generation God's praiseworthy deeds.

What also really spoke to me in *A Furrow Laid Bare*, was the explanation of why the authors chose the title. As we get set to begin a new year, and begin a new venture at Harvest, these opening words are

worth sharing. A furrow is a vision, a hope, a dream, a beginning, a frontier, a challenge, a promise, an achievement, and a way of life. It's like the dawn, breaking forth, opening on the birth of a new day [...] A Furrow Laid Bare is a furrow laid open to reveal fresh, moist, fertile soil –

ready to welcome the rays of warm golden sunshine, to drink in the penetrating rain – waiting to be fed with seed or kernel, while anticipating

wonderful miracles to occur and lending hope for an abundant harvest. It's an annual event, an ongoing process year after year, coupled with faith and prayer. We plant and seed while God provides the increase in all areas of life. Think of a furrow as only a small portion of any farm, but many furrows make a field.

So our church community is only a small part in God's vast creation, a small but important piece of the entire mosaic. We work faithfully here, cultivating an environment where our children can learn about God in all subject areas. We can set up a K-10 school, we can work hard to make sure our instruction is permeated with God's Word, where our biblical teaching falls like a gentle rain, but like the farmers we depend on God to bless our work. And as we begin a new year, our prayer is that He will indeed bless our work at Harvest and in turn help equip this next generation to serve Him faithfully as prophets, priests and kings.

### Drop Off and Pick Up

Welcome back! To all our parents & grandparents who drop off or pick up students from the school, please note the follow guidelines:

1. In the morning students will be supervised after 8:20 a.m. School begins at 8:30 a.m.

2. Please ensure that when you drop off your child they head down stairs towards the school.

3. When picking up your child, please park in the straight-line parking (not the angle parking)

and watch for any child that may be crossing the parking lot to their vehicle. School pick up is at 3:15 p.m.

4. Once a child is in their vehicle please have them stay with you to prevent any accidents.

5. After school outdoor supervision will go until 3:30p.m.

After that time your child will wait in the school or on the playground until you pick them up.

Please inform a staff member when you pick them up so we know they are leaving.

6. Please call the school to inform the staff of any late drop off or pick up.

7. If your child is going home with another family, or a different driver than normal, please make a note in the student agenda or call the school.
