The Education Committee has been busy this year. Starting in January we have been looking at staffing requirements. Now that we have Kindergarten and Grades 9 & 10, our needs are higher than ever. Last week we wrapped up another school year at Harvest. It was wonderful to come together as a community and celebrate the end of the school year and the graduation of nine students. Congratulations Bryson, Esther, Madelyn, Cooper, Noah, Anthony, Reid, and Jenna. A few days earlier we could also celebrate kindergarten graduation. Congratulations Teagan, Lauren, Colton, Brian and Tyson. We look forward to having these five young students join us full-time in the fall.

Looking back upon this past year we can again see how the Lord continues to bless our efforts to tell the next generation his praiseworthy deeds. In 2022-2023 we could expand Harvest with the addition of kindergarten and this past year we could expand again offering grade 9/10. Getting grade 9/10 off the ground took a whole community coming together and it is amazing to see what can be done when we work together. Just over a year ago there was no portable here at Harvest, playground equipment had to be moved, curriculum still needed to be ordered, finances needed to be secured, policies put in place and staffing had to be finalized. It was also great our grade 7/8's could hone their soccer and baseball skills by playing against the grade 9/10's at Having tough recess. recess competition undoubtedly helped our have success at their 7/8's tournaments (where they won every tournament but baseball in which they placed second).

It was also great seeing the grade 9/10's gel as a group as the year progressed. I know some will actually miss having class together next year, although I'm not sure teenagers will admit to such things. Grade 9/10 wrapped up the year with a camping trip at the Nordeman's (thank you Nordeman's for allowing us to use your property) and what the students lacked in sleep on that trip they made up for in fun! We wish our grade 10 students the Lord's blessing they enter senior high. Congratulations Callie, Reuben, Matthew, Jake and Jakin! You made history this past year by being the first ever grade 10's at Harvest! While the end of a school year and the start of summer brings a lot of excitement, that excitement often quickly fades and is replaced with the words: "I'm bored!" When dealing with children lamenting being bored, are several approaches parents take. When my children tell me their bored, I often

retort "that it must be great to have so much free time you don't know what to do with it!" I then follow up with a suggestion to clean up their rooms, which tends to immediately cure their boredom. Other parents deal with boredom a bit more proactively and schedule a summer full of activities, so there is no time to be bored. Whereas children often offer their own solutions to being bored by requesting screen time. And while I'm sure we all agree that is not a good solution, I know I for one have been guilty of acquiescing to this request to stop the "I'm bored" refrain.

But is boredom a bad thing? Should we try to prevent our children from boredom this summer? Interestingly, there has been a lot of recent research into this area and most find being bored as a positive. Some research has even suggested boredom might be one of the best gifts we can give our children. How so? Boredom can be the bridge between doing nothing and creativity. I am always struck by what happens when you put a bunch of students together in a room with not much in it. Suddenly a crumpled piece of paper becomes a ball, or a game of catch breaks out with an object they find lying around. Without any prompting, children will begin to make their own creative games! Boredom leads to creativity.

In one study at the University of Central Lancashire, researchers found that people were more creative after spending time on a very boring and passive task, such as reading the phone book (perhaps you have one of those still lying around your house).

The more boring the task, the more creative they were afterwards. It's believed that the more bored a person is, the more they daydream, giving their minds more time to rest and topping up their 'creativity tank'. So hopefully this summer provides lots of opportunities for our children

to top up their creativity!

With that said, summer is also a great time to learn together as a family. As Rev. Vandevelde pointed out in a recent bulletin, in the summer we are all homeschooling parents. I know many report cards went home last week in which the comments encouraged students to stay busy learning. Summer is a terrific time to read, to study God's creation, to tackle an extra devotional with the family, or to work on math (perhaps in measuring out ingredients in the kitchen or helping with a building project). Happy learning!

## Looking Ahead...

With this year now behind us we are busy looking ahead to the year to come. Work continues to take place behind the scenes as we finalize part time staff and teaching schedules, finalize curriculum for year two of high school and tackle PD work. Of note, this August Harvest will host a CARE Day (Curriculum Assistance for Reformed Education) for all the teachers in our sister schools.
